EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

KENDALL COUNTY:

Court Watch encourages the County Court system to educate judges hearing domestic violence cases in the dynamics of domestic violence.

We continue to receive monthly updates of domestic trials from the Kendall County states attorney's office. At times these updates are not timely. Kendall County case continuation dates are reported by observers, so these cases can be tracked and observed.

Kendall County bond call is now held at 1:00 PM in room 114. Court watch will be observing this process and reporting on domestic violence cases.

We urge the use of the sound system and tables in room 114 for domestic violence case proceedings. When victims and family members are sitting in the gallery, they simply cannot hear the proceedings when they are conducted at the bench. This should include the presentation of plea agreements by attorneys.

During this quarter an experienced Court Watch observer decided to take a break from attending court. She noted that: "I feel like most of my time on Judge Voiland's courtroom is wasted time as I struggle to hear what is happening. It often has a club atmosphere with all the whispering among the many attorneys usually present on the front of the courtroom, and attorneys going back and forth, in and out, with little regard for the distractions they create."

KANE COUNTY:

We urge the County court system to return to a designated court room for felony domestic violence cases. We are hopeful to hear that the Kane County Sherriff is working to partially reinstate the GPS monitoring program by September 2019. Unfortunately, there will not be enough funding to include domestic violence offenders until the middle of 2020. Many others in the domestic violence field recommend both of these practices because this is a specialized crime unlike most crimes.

We are still waiting for a real education program for judges on domestic violence. We hope this situation can be addressed very soon for the sake of the victims of domestic violence. They are the ones who suffer. They are the ones you are committed to protect.

We continue to receive a download of information from Kane County regarding domestic cases.

During the quarter several comments were made by the observers that we wanted to share. Those are as follows:

- It would be helpful if the signage outside each courtroom could be kept current for the morning and afternoon sessions.
- When new judges are assigned in room 209 there should be training conducted to help them understand DB case proceedings.
- Would it be possible to have a handout for attendees on courtroom 101 that explains basic courtroom terminology and procedures to assist them in understanding how to proceed.
- Courtroom 101 always seems to be crowded, seating is very limited.

QUARTERLY RESULTS:

During first quarter of 2019 a total of 93 observations were reported. (Kane County: 42 reports; Kendall County: 51 reports) Several cases were observed and reported on by multiple observers. Court Watch encourages this practice because it provides differing opinions on these cases. Observation outcomes breakdown as follows:

Kane County:

- 25 cases were continued.
- 2 cases were dismissed.
- 6 cases resulted in a guilty verdict.
- 2 cases resulted in a guilty plea.
- 0 cases resulted in a not guilty verdict.
- 1 OP request was granted.
- 5 OP requests were denied.
- 1 mistrial.

Kendall County:

- 12 cases were continued.
- 5 cases were dismissed.
- 4 cases resulted in a guilty verdict.
- 1 case resulted in plea to common battery.
- 12- cases resulted in a not guilty verdict.
- 1 sentencing hearing was observed.
- 13 DB bond call cases were observed.
- 1 order of protection was granted.
- 1 one case was not DB.
- 1 case was closed.
